

Coatings Inspector Level 2 Institute of Corrosion (ICorr)

Training guidelines for final examinations

Pre-requisites

The student must have ICorr Level 1 and a minimum of 12 months inspection experience in the protective coatings industry after qualifying at Level 1 before taking the course. If the student wishes to go direct for Level 2 without ICorr Level 1 then they must have 5 years inspection experience.

1. What happens when I have registered for the training?

Once registered you will be required to log in to the on line training course and complete all modules in the order they appear. Most of the modules will require the completion of an assessment. You will need to achieve 100% pass in each of these assessments before proceeding to the next module.

2. What happens once I have completed the on line training?

Once the on line training has been completed you will need to contact the assessment centre to arrange the following

- A) A date for your practical training. Practical training days are arranged to familiarise yourself with the equipment used by a Coatings Inspector. The training will fully prepare you for the practical assessment element of the level 2 examination. You will not be required to bring any of your own equipment to the training centre.
- B) A date for your examination at the accredited assessment centre. If the first examination day is fully booked you will be offered an alternative date.

3. What do I need to bring with me to my examination day?

You will be required to bring your own pens (no pencils will be allowed) in either black or blue. A pocket calculator, one which cannot store mathematical formulations. All paper will be provided by the test centre.

You will be required to bring along photograph ID, this can be either your passport or photo type driving licence and 2 passport photographs if you have not already provided these to the assessment centre. This should be shown to your examiner prior to taking the examinations.

4. How should I prepare for the assessment?

Ensure that you have allowed sufficient time to revise the course content before your assessment day. Ensure you have all the equipment as outlined above.

5. What form will the examinations take?

ICorr Level 2 Coatings Inspector examinations are as follows

- a) 2 specific Inspection examinations.

One of which the format is multiple choice with 30 questions (45 mins duration). The second is 4 short essay questions (60 mins duration).

Pass mark 70%

- b) 2 General Coating & Inspection examinations

One of which the format is multiple choice with 40 questions (60 mins duration). The second is 5 short essay questions (75 mins duration)

Pass mark 70%

- C) There are 2 Practical examinations for Level 2.

The first to demonstrate competence in using basic inspection equipment. The candidate will be required to show an understanding of how and where such equipment would be used by the paint inspector (60 mins duration)

Pass mark 100%

The second takes the form of a practical written essay (60 mins duration)

Pass Mark 70%

6. When will I receive my results?

The test centre will advise you of your results within 3 days. Upon successful completion you will be issued your certificate and wallet card. If you have been unsuccessful you will be advised of which examinations you have failed and offered a date to re take the examinations. If you passed the practical examination you will not be require to re take this on the new date.
