

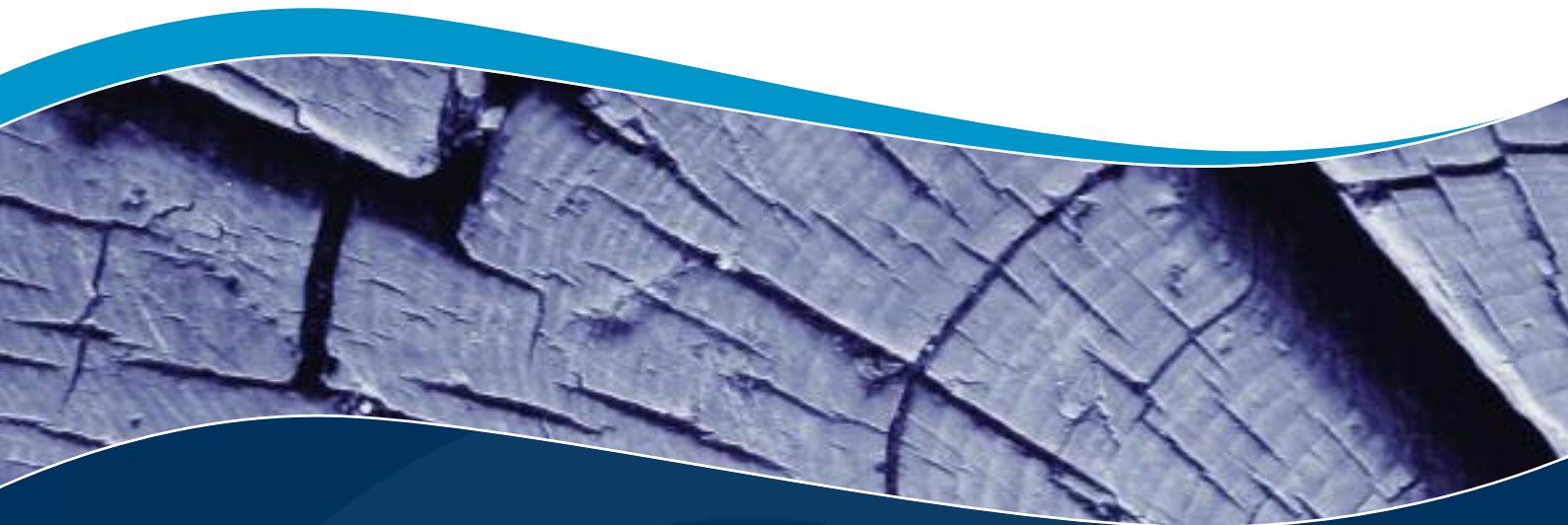

The Conference

The marine coatings industry is truly a global business, and the aim of this conference is to provide a forum for the exchange of information on best practices from experts in coatings, shipbuilding and environmental protection.

There will be four sessions over the two days, covering new developments in coating technology, effect of shipbuilding techniques on coating performance and maintenance and inspection.

The Marine Coatings Conference is sponsored by PCE, Drydock and JPCL magazines in conjunction with SMM Shipbuilding Machinery & Marine Technology International Trade Fair, Hamburg.

Who Should Attend

This is an opportunity to meet and exchange views with marine coatings experts from around the world, and the conference will have broad appeal to those involved in the protection of marine vessels against corrosion, including ship owners and operators, marine superintendants, consultants, classification societies, surveyors, ship building and repair yard staff, coatings manufacturers and surface preparation equipment manufacturers.

SMM Exhibition

The conference is being held in conjunction with SMM, The Shipbuilding, Machinery and Marine Technology Trade Fair. The conference will take place within the exhibition showgrounds; and to allow delegates to visit the exhibition, time has been set aside at the end of each session. Registration at the conference will give free admission to the whole trade fair.

The Venue

Hamburg is an excellent venue for the conference, the city is easily reached from the main cities in Europe by road and train. (There is a Deutsche Bahn connection every hour with all major cities in central and northern Europe, and express trains all call at Dammtor station, a 10-minute walk from the exhibition grounds). The airport is only 20 minutes from the city centre and conference venue, with flights from many cities in Europe and by connection at Frankfurt, with cities around the world.

Hamburg is the second largest city in Germany, with many fine restaurants and a good public transport system. It also has a strong seafaring tradition. It is a major seaport and is the central hub for trade with northern and eastern Europe and the second most important container port in Europe.

Conference Arrangements

The conference will be held in Marseille rooms 4-6 of the Hamburg Messe Fairground. The Fairground is easily reached by public transport.

Delegates will receive FREE SMM exhibition passes, prior to the conference, which must be worn to access the Fairgrounds.
